Message from the principal!

I trust that all our students and school families experienced a relaxing and enjoyable term break. We anticipate that Term 4 will be an exciting, full, enjoyable term for all and, while our teachers will all be focused on ensuring the best teaching, learning, and assessing experiences embedded across all classrooms, we are also keeping a focus on increasing student wellbeing and engagement across the school. Ensuring that we provide a wide range of academic and non-academic experiences and opportunities for our students to participate, succeed and thrive is considered of vital importance, as well as ensuring we strengthen positive teacher-student partnerships so that students feel they are welcomed and valued at our school. We will be gathering student wellbeing and engagement data gathered this year and we anticipate seeing a positive increase from student information gathered at the start of the year. We are also looking forward to gathering information from parents between now and 4 November (end of Week 4) through the "Tell Them From Me" student From Me" parent survey.



We see this survey window as a very important opportunity for parents and carers to have their say about what's working and what can be improved about our school. TTFM parent survey gathers information about 8 key drivers of school improvement: Parent participation; Parents feeling informed; Parents feeling welcome; Parents supporting learning at home, Safety at school; School supporting learning; School supporting positive behaviour; Inclusivity at school. We are very keen to lift participation in the TTFM parent survey this year as we recognise how valuable a high participation rate

is for us: the information we gather will more reliably identify areas of strength and areas for improvement from the perspective of parents, and to inform practical changes where needed. 
Important changes to last day of Term 4

The NSW department of education has recently announced that there is a change to the date for the last day of Term 4. Students will now finish school on Friday 16 December 2022 as an additional School Development Day is being provided across NSW public schools to allow our staff to participate in professional learning that we missed during COVID-19. This will assist us to effectively prepare and plan ahead for 2023 to ensure we meet the needs of our students. Parents will need to arrange alternative care for their children on Monday 19 December.

Building community connections - update on our Breakfast Club!

Breakfast club has been an initiative driven by our school leadership team and in conjunction with community clubs and businesses. We're really excited to see this new and exciting school program which commenced this week. We have started by offering breakfast two days a week (Mondays and Fridays) from 8:30-9:10am. Our student school leaders have been outstanding ambassadors for this new school program and were very excited to be involved in writing and submitting an application for funding support to Bendigo Bank, which was successful! As a result, the school will receive \$1200.00 which will be used to purchase a freezer, toasters and chopping boards. Engaging with and utilising student voice, our school leaders have conducted a student survey to find the most popular spreads for toast. It's been great to see the way this program is building community connections and strong local partnerships. Our local Rotary Club has offered volunteers to staff the breakfast club and our school leaders would also like the opportunity to volunteer. Coles at Woy Woy will be donating bread each week in support of the program. Next steps include our school leaders creating advertising posters for the school and to go on Facebook, newsletter and school app, as well as a google form to create management schedules for those running the club. Risk assessment processes are currently being completed so that we can achieve our target of trialling the program in Term 4 this year and a full launch in 2023.





SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT PROCESS FOR PLACEMENT IN YEAR 7 IN 2024

Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2024 open on 18 October 2022. Applications will close on 16 November 2022. **The due date is strictly observed**. Requests for late applications will be approved only under very specific and well-documented circumstances.

All candidates are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on Thursday 4 May 2023.

The online application dashboard enables parents to log in to make updates and add attachments even after an application is submitted. Parents also communicate directly with the Selective Education Unit through the system's messages feature.
