## **NAPLAN 2022**

This fortnight will see some minor adjustments to school routines as we engage in formal assessment processes related to NAPLAN. Our relieving deputy principal, Mrs Nott, has done an amazing job setting up systems with exceptional organisation, to ensure assessment processes run smoothly over the next two weeks: quite a logistical feat! In addition, our Year 3 and Year 5 teachers have been supporting, encouraging and reassuring our students in the lead up to this assessment window. On behalf of our teachers, I must say "very well done" to all our students who commenced assessments today and I welcome parent input to ensure these assessments are calmly and positively approached: encouraging and supporting your children to positively approach these tasks and helping them to feel prepared to do their best is a great help in reducing any possible anxiety, as well as allowing your child to discuss any questions or concerns they may not have raised with their teacher. Remind your child that both their family and their school just want to see every student try their best. We trust that parents will be encouraging and communicating how you are proud of the effort your child puts in, and for any resilience they show in the face of concern or anxiety about formal testing: this is a great step towards building a positive mindset. NAPLAN assessments continue next week and additional catch-up days will be provided if students miss assessment days.

## CLOSE CONTACTS ATTENDING SCHOOL

Students and staff who are close contacts and have **no symptoms** can attend school with the expectation that agreed NSW Health guidelines are completely followed. Close contacts attending school will need to adhere to the following in addition to NSW Health guidelines:

- Notify the school of a positive case in the family.
- Notify NSW Health of a positive case.
- Notify outside of school hours care (OOSHC) provider if they are intending to return under this
  provision.
- Conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result each morning before attending school for 5 school days.
- No student or staff member identified as a close contact will be permitted to participate in overnight excursions, including school camps.
- Any visitor to a school site who is a close contact is required to advise the school that they are a close contact before they come on site. These visitors should conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result before attending. They must also wear a mask indoors at all times.

The department's Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing case management team will continue to work with schools around temporary use of additional COVID- smart measures for short periods of time based on localised risk assessments.

Students and staff at greater risk of serious illness, if they were to contract COVID-19, should speak with their health care professional to review their health support plan or COVID-19 action plan and speak with the school about any local considerations.

#### ATTENDANCE UPDATE

Our school is now using SMS communication to notify and request information from parents regarding student absences. We trust that this will provide a practical, time-efficient medium for productive communication between home and school. Messages can be sent and received in real time and are also a convenient channel to communicate urgent information across the whole school community, if required. If you know in advance that your child is going to be away from school, please email your child's teacher or the school (or ring the office) so that we can enter this attendance data prior to our daily automatic SMS notifications being sent. In the case where parents receive SMS requests for attendance information for more than one child, we request that each individual SMS is responded to, as the information you provided is automatically transferred to our roll marking system. Thank you in advance for supporting us with this request.

## STAFF EMAILS

This term we will be utilising staff emails to increase the effectiveness of our school communication. We expect that parents and staff will ensure that all emails sent will be respectful and constructive. Should concerns arise, our school values face-to-face meetings or phone calls rather than relying on email communication. We recognise that email can be a convenient form of communication and is often the preferred choice for parents who find it difficult to catch up with school staff during regular work hours. We trust that families will understand that teachers will also send or respond to emails at a time convenient to them, within school work hours.

Emails are not recommended for communicating urgent or critical matters. It is always best to speak with the member of staff concerned by telephone or in person. Please contact the school to arrange a time to discuss urgent or critical matters with the appropriate person. If the teacher is unavailable, a message will be taken and followed up promptly.

## Parent use of email to communicate with class teachers

- Email can be used by parents to request information on a simple matter, student absences or to request a time for a telephone call or meeting for more detailed or complex matters. We ask that emails remain brief and informative. Issues requiring detailed discussion should be dealt with in person or over the phone.
- The academic progress, learning expectations or behavioural issues related to children will not be discussed via email. Discussions of this nature should be conducted over the phone at an arranged time, or in person.
- The NSW Department of Education email system is only to be used for school related matters.
- Staff responses to emails may take up to 48 hours depending on complexity of issue, teacher workload, weekends and holidays. Teachers may choose to respond to work related emails outside of school hours, but there is no professional expectation to do so.
- We request that parent emails remain positive and solution-focused.
